



Improving your transit this fall

As part of the Customer-First Action Plan, OC Transpo is putting you first this fall, with new travel options and a more reliable transit experience across the network and on Para Transpo to support your trips.

These changes include broader system-wide improvements to enhance the customer experience across the City, as well as targeted measures that focus on key employment areas. OC Transpo will monitor the system on an ongoing basis, making adjustments as needed based on staff observations and customer feedback. Additional buses will be available on standby to support service where required.

Here's how we'll keep you moving



Improved weekday frequency on O-Train Line 1 and an earlier start to weekday service on O-Train Line 2.



New Express bus service and Park & Ride connections to improve transit access to major employment areas.



More reliable schedules for 30 bus routes; improving reliability for over 50% of riders.



Improvement to Para Transpo service to strengthen reliability for customers.

Enhanced O-Train service



Line 1 will continue double car train service Monday to Friday, with over 90 new departures, providing customers with increased weekday frequencies:

- **Every 4 minutes at peak periods** (previously 5).
- **Every 6 minutes midday** (previously 10).
- **Every 7 minutes early evening** (previously 10).

Line 2 weekday service from the south end will start earlier, with first trains at 6 am from Limebank Station and 6:05 am from Carleton Station.

New Express bus service

- New peak period **Express trips** serving Park & Ride lots in Kanata and Orléans, key employment areas, and O-Train Line 1 stations.
- **Direct service** with limited stops along the way.
- **Faster travel times** for customers at the same fare as regular service.
- Express trips will be clearly designated on signage and at stations, with route numbers in the 500s.

New connections to Gatineau



- Some trips on **Routes 74, 75, 561, 562 and 563** will continue to Gatineau from Tunney's Pasture Station, offering a direct connection from Kanata and Barrhaven. No need to transfer!
